*Jean Monnet Module on the European Union and the Contemporary Sub-Saharan Africa –
an Interdisciplinary Approach - Smart Specialisation-EUAfrica/AFROEU*

Objectives:

- equip students and young professionals with knowledge of European Union subjects relevant for their academic and professional lives and enhance their civic skills,
- mainstream and diversify EU-related subjects throughout the curricula proposed by higher education institutions to their students.
- promote research and first teaching experience for young researchers and scholars in EU issues,
- foster the publication and dissemination of the results of academic research
- deliver tailor-made courses on specific EU issues relevant for graduates in their professional life.

Activities

- creation and addition of two new courses (in Polish and English) to the WSE curriculum covering SubSaharan Africa integration issues and related policies in the EU context,
- 240 hours for the two new courses (6 semesters).
- Research activities carried out during the whole project in alignment with other activities in order to ensure their up-to-date scientific accuracy and relevance.
- Events, which simultaneously combine scientific, educational and promotional functions, will encompass:
 - 3 open cross-sector roundtable debates (once a year) concerning EU-AFRICA partnership and economic relations policy in the EU,
 - 1 conference
 - 6 workshops dedicated to degree seminar's participants at WSE.
- Preparation and maintenance of the deliverables, which will aim to inform and promote: the project, the subject matter, the EU studies and Jean Monnet Activities in general, as well as European integration, will include:
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Outcomes and impact

- 240 hours/6 semesters of teaching in English/Polish of two EU foreign policy courses for around 240 students.
- Creation of custom course materials available on the project's website
- Publication of at least 2 articles in the well-known Journal, which will present the project's research results.
- 3 international round-table, with total participation of 200 people
- 1 open conference with total participation of 150 people

Long-term outcome

Creating a hub for EU foreign policy teaching, research and analysis within the new SGH AFRICAN CENTER, thus assuring greater visibility of this field of study at the national (Polish) and transnational levels.
