A/ Location

Sudan is located in the north-east corner of Africa. It overlooks the Red Sea between Egypt and Eritrea, The river Nile is considered as the most eminent element in Sudan's geography, and Nile basin constitutes approximately 67,4 % of the surface of Sudan.

Compared to other countries over the world, Sudan is the sixteenth globally, the second in Africa and the third in the Arabic world.

Land is 1,752,187 km<sup>2</sup>, and sea is 129,813 km<sup>2</sup>.

3/ Climate:

Sudan's climate ranges from desert to semi-desert in the north of the country to savanna average rainfall in the centre of the country to the Mediterranean climate

on the coast of the Red Sea and the Jebel Mara area of Darfur State. Temperature reaches a maximum of 45 ° in summer and a minimum of 6 ° in winter.

#### 4/ Airports, airstrips and seaports:

In Sudan there are 14 airports (six of them are international airports) with paved runways and 6 airstrips for helicopters. The Red Sea, the maritime port to the outside world, has got 7 ports : Port Sudan, Sawakin, Osaif, Basha'ir, South Port, Green Port and Kheir Port.

#### 5/ Terrain:

Generally flat plains with Highlands represented in series of the Red Sea and series of Jebel Marra.

The highest point: Jabal Marra 3,024 m.

Lowest point: Red Sea 0 m.

Minerals: oil, iron, gold, copper, chrome, zinc and mica.

Final approval is given by the export management section in the customs house.

### 3/ Housing and rent

Housing is available and in hand to everybody.

### 4/ Education system

Education on two levels: public and private. The private education is available in most parts of the Sudan for foreigner and local citizens.

### 5/ Marketing

In Sudan, there are many types of markets meeting the needs of consumption. Moreover, there are special centers for marketing with international standard. Also, there are markets in the neighborhood in the capital covering all the needs of people in the Sudan. These markets are available and in hand to everybody.

### 6/ Entertainment and recreation

There are many places for recreation in the capital and in other parts of the Sudan. Different places of child entertainment exist in the capital. There are recreation centers for children, cinemas and theaters for different types of arts. Also, there are public and private parks. In the Sudan, there are public and touristic nature reserves, museums for archeology and history. There is the Nile and its different branches. There are places for water ski, restaurants and cafeterias serving different foods and social and cultural, foreign and Sudanese clubs.

### 7/ Hotels

Hotel services in the Sudan developed to meet the needs, and the investment in the hotel trade expanded broadly. There are Sudanese world-class hotels in all grades of five stars ranging to motel and pension, then popular agencies in the capital and all parts of the Sudan.

### 8/ The most important tourist landmarks

Tourism in Sudan evolved broadly and Sudan is full of rare tourist resources in the Nile attractive beaches and historical heritage which hit in the depths of history in

the ancient civilizations the Sudan, making a steady development in tourism in Sudan. There are Sudan natural reserves such as al-Dinder, al-Radom and Gebel Marra in the West, besides ancient civilizations in the North such as Karma, Kush and Merowe, Nebta as well as the national museum and Caliph's house and other museums scattered in different parts of Sudan. As to what attracts tourists in Sudan is the sophisticated dealing with tourists as they are guests of the country. The Sudanese are generous and magnanimous in receiving the guests. There are also ethnic pluralities created from different types of census and tribes in Sudan.

#### 9/ Internal transports and cars rental in the Sudan

Network of transportation entered in the capital to meet the needs of foreign citizens to reach all areas easily and conveniently through public and private transport. There are companies that rent vehicles to move inside and outside the capital (Limousine) that meet the needs of tourists and investors to reach all parts of Sudan and at economy prices.

#### Thirdly: The investment atmosphere in the Sudan

The investment atmosphere in the Sudan is related to the following basic points:

##### 1/ geographical location:

Sudan takes its geographical location in the horn of Africa being open to the Arabic Peninsula, Bab el-mandeb, the Suez Canal through the Red Sea. This makes it a meeting point for the movement of ships between the Indian Ocean and the Mediterranean.

The location of the Sudan north of equatorial and south of Great Sahara makes it a central place for international aviation in departure to Africa (it is a market for four hundred million persons from Comessa countries) and transboundary movement from West Africa to the east. In addition to the demographic, geological and climatic reality which opens the door for coming road from neighboring countries.

### B/ Infrastructures:

Sudan has reasonable infrastructures especially in the North and the Centre, and there is a constant progress in infrastructure in Sudan which allows the investors a flexible movement in investing in all sites and the flow of its production to the markets inside and outside Sudan. These infrastructures are represented in paved roads, airports, ports, river transport, railways, modern communications, electricity, water and sanitation.

4/ Legislations:

**The most important features of the investment law of 2013:**

- Rehabilitation

What distinguishes this law is that it contains rehabilitation projects, which include the reconstruction and modernization activities and the expansion of projects that exist to increase production capacities. Such activities are treated as new investment projects so they are granted all privileges given to new projects.

- Preferential advantages

To ensure the national aspect of the National Investment Authority and its orientation of incoming investment to the different States of the Sudan in order to contribute in achieving the social and economic development in the country, the Investment Law intended to apply preferential advantages aiming at orienting the investment to the region of less development and to determined economic sectors.

- Incentive facilities

- Exemptions

- This law is characterized in this aspect that it stipulates the exemption of the imports of the investment projects of capital goods from VAT and customs.

- Allocation of national land

- Concerning the allocation of national land, this Law makes provision that the competent authorities in the States shall register the plots for industrial, services, and agricultural projects, do the detailed and artistic planning, prepare the necessary maps and submit them to the National Investment Authority for the allocation.

- Fees and levies

For the objective of completing the process of coordination between the NIA and the States with respect the States fees on national investment projects, the Law makes provision that the taxation on national investment project or on national or

State strategic project will be determined by consultation and agreeing with States and related authorities within the framework of the Council.

- Settlement of investment disputes:
- Prosecutions and specialized courts

This Law comprises the articles 40 and 41 that make provision of establishing the attorney offices and the competent courts for the examination and the disposition of investment cases. In addition to this, the Sudan complies with the regional and international agreements and engagements for the resolution of investment conflicts.

- The Law stipulates for the first time the salaries and the allowances of non-Sudanese workers who work in the investment project do not depend to the social insurance.

#### 5/ Administrative status

- High Council for investment

This law is characterized by providing for the establishment of supreme council for investment and identified as a higher authority responsible for investment in the countries in term of authorization its policies, plans, strategies and it determines its fields and priorities and remove all the obstacles it encountered. The role played by this law was not only restricted to this limit, but it links the council to the National Investment Authority by appointing the head of NIA as a reporter of the supreme council for investment in order to achieve more harmony and consistency in the management of investment process.

- The National Investment Authority

The Law also identified the NIA as an executive mechanism which also included the preparation of proposed investment priorities and submit them to the supreme council for investment for the purpose of notification and preparing a national investment map, in addition to mention the provisions of coordination with all competent authorities in the centre and the States.

## • One Stop Shop

The practice has proved that the One Stop Shop system is the most effective administrative system in eliminating the problems of bureaucracy because this system allows saving the time and effort which are considered the largest cost component for the investor. The presence of the most competent services by the approval for the investment in one site achieves sequences in the procedures and the direct communication between staff; it also helps to use electronic system in completing the procedures.

What increases the effectiveness of single-window system is the scope of that authorization granted by governmental units for its employees in a single-window system.

Among the advantages of this law is that it makes full mandate for the commissioners from their units which can speed decision-making.

The included the text that binds the investment authority in the States to establish the single-window system to manage the investment processes

## 6/ Foreign relations

- Sudan has signed agreements in the field of the protection and encouragement of the investment with the following countries:

Kuwait, Algeria, Oman, Egypt, Yemen, Arab Emirates, Syria, Qatar, Lebanon, Tunisia, Morocco, Djibouti, Jordan, Indonesia, Malaysia, Iran, China, Turkey, Bahrain, Mauritania, Ethiopia, Chad, South Africa, Holland, Bulgaria, Belgium, Switzerland and Italy.

Sudan is a member in some regional and international, economic and commercial organizations including:

### (A) Common Market for East and South Africa Countries (COMESA)

COMESA comprises 20 countries as members. This makes available a big market for the movement of the goods and services. It must be mentioned that there is a project of law for the investment in the COMESA region for regulating the investment and unifying its laws within the countries of the group. Membership in

the COMESA allows making use of AGOA agreement between the COMESA and the USA which permits the entrance of the group products to the American markets.

(B) Greater Arab Free Trade Area (GAFTA)

Sudan is a member in the GAFTA, so it has the advantage of considering a gradual application of the zero tariffs on the imports to reach the full exemption by the year 2010.

(C) World Trade Organization (WTO)

Arrangements are being made for Sudan's accession to the world trade organization membership where it is participating now as an observer. After the expected accession, the Sudan can make use of the exceptions and the preferential advantages for developing countries and the least developed countries from same exemptions in most agreements which give the Sudan a preferential advantage in investment.

(D) United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO)

Sudan has a distinguished relation with the UNIDO which offers it a lot of technical assistance in the framework of the integrated program of the country for the promotion of the industrial performance of the country.

(E) World Association of Investment Promotion Agencies (WAIPA).

(F) Multilateral Investment Guarantee Agency (MIGA)

(G) Inter-Arab Investment Guarantees Corporation (IAIGC) (Kuwait)

(H) Islamic Development Bank (Jadda)

(I) Arabic Organization for industrial development and mining (AOIDM)

This is one of the organizations of the Arabic League. Sudan is a member in it and it offers Sudan the technical assistance in the field of industrial development.

(J) Other organizations and other groups:



In addition to the above mentioned organizations, Sudan is a member in two groups: IGAD and Sahel and Sahara Group.

#### **Fourthly: natural resources:**

##### 1/ Agricultural and animal resources:

Sudan is rich in diverse natural resources in its land, climate and underground. In the agricultural aspect, the Sudan possesses about 140 million fedans of agricultural lands near rivers or water resources or irrigated by the rains.

The diversity of climates has impact on the diversity of agricultural production in the Sudan as in many countries around the world. This includes fruits, oilseeds, food grains, gum Arabic, and other diverse crops, thanks to the fertile lands and the abundant water. Sudan has a huge livestock spread in large areas of natural pastures and reached in 2013 a total of (105,335) heads – in 2014 a total of (105.858) heads, (of camels, cows, sheep and goats), ( Source: Annual report of the Central Sudan Bank 2014).

In addition to the huge wealth of wildlife. Moreover, the available part of the wealth of fishes in the different rivers and the Red Sea represents a big nutrition stock. The natural pastures in the Sudan is characterized the fact that they are not treated by chemicals and there is diversity of nutritional and category values of these pastures according to climates. Also, livestock is grown in irrigated areas as a modern sector. The Sudan has got a big potential of livestock for export in the field of meats to the Arab and global regions.

##### 2/ Mineral and petroleum resources

The Sudan is replete with large oil and mineral wealth including minerals: gold, chrome, iron, copper, uranium, cement, gypsum, marble, mica, tin, and other many minerals in the east and west of the country. Moreover, there are huge quantities of petroleum reserve not yet extracted, so opportunities are available for investment in this field. The previous extraction of the petroleum has had big impact on the support of the economic development.

#### **Fifthly: important information for the investor**

1/ National projects are the projects that the location of their facilities in more than one State or foreign investment or joint with foreign parties.

2/ State investment projects are those established within any one of the investment fields regulated by a State investment law.

3/ Advantages and facilities are given according to the guidance of the concerned State to the National Investment Authority.

4/ Capital equipments and production inputs are automatic features according to the customs Law. They do not require a decision from the NIA.

### **Registration procedures**

1/ Investment entity:

The investor can choose one of the following investment forms:

- Individual property
- Partnership
- Companies
- Branch of a foreign company

2/ Companies registration procedures

An application addressed to the commercial registrar containing the proposed names.

Company contract and regulations of the establishment of the company

Procedures after the initial approval:

Preparing the company's headquarters

Presenting the company regulations document sealed by the taxes and the zakat and in three copies

Filling form (12) concerning the company capital

Filling form (2 ش) concerning the declaration

Judicial form (publication form)

### **3/ Registration procedures for a branch of a foreign company**

Registration application addressed to the commercial registrar

Contract of establishment and regulations of the parent company

Registration list or the document of establishing the parent company

Notarized power of attorney from the company to a person resides in the Sudan for receiving judicial notifications.

Decision of the board directors of the parent company to open a branch of it in the Sudan.

Opening the previous documents with the seal of the company and notarizing them by the ministry of foreign affairs of the country where the registration took place or by the Sudanese embassy in that country.

### **4/ Procedures for registration of business name**

The applicant must commit to the following:

Submit an application containing the proposed names for the registration of the business name in Arabic and English languages.

Fill the form for registration of the business name and get a lawyer notarization.

Get the approval of the competent authority.

When the precedent conditions are met and the procedures are completed, the applicant will be given two establishing certificates in Arabic and English languages together, with the signature of the registrar of the business names and the seal of the General Registrar of the companies.

### **5/ Migration procedures**

All the migration procedures: entry visa, residence permit, registration of foreign investors and renewals are done in the Unit of foreigners passports in the Ministry of interior.

## **6/ Foreign manpower in the Sudan**

Manpower is treated according to the Law of encouragement of the national investment 2013 and the Labor Law 2007. All the procedure of the manpower are achieved in the Ministry of Labor and in the investment management sections in the States.

## **7/ Documents required for the registration of the foreign capital**

Contract of establishment of the company – in the case of the affiliation of the project to a company.

Registration certificate of the company.

Business name of the company.

License of the investment.

### **In the case of the financial capital**

a- A document proving the transfer of the amount from abroad.

b- The declarations of the exchange to the local currency.

### **In the case of the capital in-kind**

Import certificates for the machines, equipments and devices or (im) forms.

### **In the case of the service capital**

Certified lists of the paid amounts, approved by a resident Sudanese legal auditor.

## **8/ Procedures for issuing the register of exporters and importers**

The final license of the investment

The business name

The membership of the industry and trade chamber

Testimony from the bank concerning the project account number

In the case of companies, contract of establishment + establishment certificate approved by the registrar of companies.

In the case of the renewal of the register for the companies, cooperative societies, institutions, and corporations must get their deposits (ش 28) and (ش 5) from the attorney general chamber.

The commercial license for the individuals must be renewed this year for the purpose of importation and exportation.

Service projects: 15 % is the business profit tax.

Industrial projects: 10 % is the business profit tax.

Agricultural projects: total exemption from the business profit tax.

A budget approved by the tax management (in the case of vehicles of the strategic projects).

When the list is submitted to the customs, it is required to attach the approval for working in a hired location (in the case of rented locations).

The tourism activities (hotels, resorts, etc.) give a list of needs for a hired location (long term renting, for ten years or more).

The signature to the contract of settling the partnership is to be matched to the application.



The partnership will not be settled except after implementation and running of the project.
